

## Math Teacher Job Interview

### Introduction Part

Tell us about yourself: This will be among the first common teacher interview questions at almost every in-person. Just give a brief background in about three sentences. Tell them what colleges you graduated from, what you're certified to teach, what you're teaching & working experiences are, and why you'd love the job.

### Question Part

- Why did you decide to become a teacher?
- Why do you want to be a math teacher?
- What is your teaching philosophy?
- How many years of experience do you have for Math teacher position?
- What are your strengths? What are your weaknesses?
- Are you familiar with this school? What are your impressions of it?
- Why are you the right candidate for the job?
- Would you be interested in participating in after school activities?
- How do you see yourself in five years'?
- How do you handle a discipline problem? What about noise in the classroom?
- Are you a "tough" teacher or an "understanding" teacher?
- How do you handle a gifted child who is a discipline problem? Time?
- How do you handle the needs of children with high abilities as compared to the needs of low-skilled children?
- Would you be interested in leading any after-school activities?
- What would you do if you suspected neglect or abuse in the home of one of your students?
- If you noticed a child being bullied in your class, how would you deal with the situation?
- What type of classroom management structure would you implement if you were hired?
- How have you used, or how will you use, technology in the classroom?
- Explain what will be your approach when a lesson does not work well?
- How would you deal with a student who is habitually late?
- What would you say to an angry parent about their child's grade?
- How will you prepare students for standardized assessments?
- Describe your teaching method – how would it help pupils get to grips with math?
- How would you boost a pupil's self-confidence if they were struggling with basic math skills?
- How do you plan to get girls interested in math?
- How do you plan to use technology in a typical math lesson?
- How would you encourage the practical applications of mathematical thinking in everyday life?
- How do you handle parent complaints about teaching methods?
- How often do you report to parents? What is your communication method with parents?
