
Abstract

Abstract: In a competitive research landscape, researchers can no longer afford to just publish and hope for receiving impact. To leave a mark, researchers have to take their impact into their own hands. Researchers need to keep all of their scholarly output in a database, to share through academic social networking sites. Researchers also, should create a "permalink" for each of their publications. A "permalink" is a stable, permanent (or persistent) link to an online journal article or subscription resource, that can be accessed from any computer at any time. It is often different to the URL that appears at the top of your browser - the link displayed there may be session dependent, and will only work for a particular person in a particular time period. This presentation provides guidelines on how to create a publication database for enhancing research visibility and citations.

Gold Open Access Journals

 Journals that automatically and immediately make their articles available online to all at no cost (the articles are always free to read).

Gold OA journals do not take copyright.
 They use Creative Commons licenses instead.

Green Open Access Journals

 Traditional, subscription-based journals that permit authors to self-archive their articles in OA repositories.

 In general, Green OA journals do take copyright, but "give back" some rights to the author.

Traditional Toll Access Journals

Subscription-based journals that require authors to transfer copyright to the Journal, which then has exclusive rights to the article.

Publishers and copyright

- Assigning copyright to a publisher does not generally mean that you cannot deposit in a repository
- Most publishers now permit authors to deposit a copy of their articles in repositories
- This is a right granted to authors over and above any copyright agreement you have signed
- However, most publishers will only allow you to deposit your 'author final version' of your work
- Some publishers have embargo periods, e.g. an article can only be deposited in a repository 6 months after publication

Your publication freely available

Besides the bibliographic details, you can add the publication itself to UvA-DARE, in pdf or Word. Of course, you yourself decide whether you only want to archive it (in which case the electronic version is not accessible) or if you wish to give interested researchers and readers full access to the electronic publication. There are great advantages to making it worldwide available. Publications which are freely available are most often downloaded and cited.

If your publisher does not give permission to give access to the definitive publisher's version/pdf, in many cases it is permitted to make the last author's version available (i.e. the version after peer review). This version has the same scientific content, but lacks the publisher's lay-out. More information can be found at <a href="https://www.sheen.com/sheen.co

Springer's Self-Archiving Policy

Springer is a green publisher, as we allow self-archiving, but most importantly we are fully transparent about your rights.

Publishing in a subscription-based journal

If you publish an article in the traditional way, without open access our Copyright Transfer Statements reads (excerpt): "Authors may self-archive the author's accepted manuscript of their articles on their own websites. Authors may also deposit this version of the article in any repository, provided it is only made publicly available 12 months after official publication or later. He/ she may not use the publisher's version (the final article), which is posted on SpringerLink and other Springer websites, for the purpose of self-archiving or deposit. Furthermore, the author may only post his/her version provided acknowledgement is given to the original source of publication and a link is inserted to the published article on Springer's website. The link must be accompanied by the following text: "The final publication is available at link.springer.com". "Prior versions of the article published on non-commercial pre-print servers like arXiv.org can remain on these servers and/or can be updated with the author's accepted version. The final published version (in PDF or HTML/XML format) cannot be used for this purpose. Acknowledgement needs to be given to the final publication and a link should be inserted to the published article on Springer's website, accompanied by the text "The final publication is available at link.springer.com".

Publishing open access

If you publish your article open access, the final published version can be archived in institutional or funder repositories and can be made publicly accessible immediately.

Find a stable URL

 For most e-journals, the web address ('URL') of the article that you see in the browser address bar is not stable; i.e. it may work for you right now, but it may not work tomorrow, and it might not work for other users. To make a link that will always lead your students to the correct article, you need to find a stable URL (also called a persistent URL or permalink).

Finding a permanent link

DOI permanent links

- Sometimes you will see only a DOI, and not a permanent link, when viewing the citation information for an article. A DOI is a standardized method for identifying an electronic object. DOIs often appear in the citation or the abstract of an article or even in its full-text format.
- When you have located a DOI, follow these steps to complete the link.
 - To convert the DOI to a URL, precede it with the following:
 - http://dx.doi.org/ For example, the doi:10.1123/japa.2015-0188
 becomes: http://dx.doi.org/10.1123/japa.2015-0188
 This is sufficient if the article is available for free.
- Tip: If you cannot find the DOI of an article, try using the following tool: http://www.crossref.org/guestquery/

DOAI (Digital Open Access Identifier)

http://doai.io/

DOAI (Digital Open Access Identifier) is an alternate DOI (Digital Object Identifier) resolver that takes you to a free version of the requested article, when available.

To use it, replace dx.doi.org by doai.io in any DOI link.

How to Create Permanent Links to Online Articles

The Library subscribes to many databases that allow linking to full text articles. Instead of using the URL from your browser's address bar, which may quickly expire, you should create a permanent link. This link will provide a stable and permanent URL to a specific journal article, which can be used in online courses, reading lists or bibliographies.

Locate Permanent Link in Article

Find the desired article or journal page and look for a permanent link which may be provided by the publisher.

Look for words such as, "persistent URL", "stable URL"," infomark", "permanlink", "document URL", "durable link", "linking options for this record", or "DOI".

However, not all articles have permanent links.




- Reference management tools saves time for researchers and help them work more efficiently;

- Create stand alone bibliographies in a wide variety of styles







Why use *EndNote*?






ScienceDirect (Elsevier) allows you to check your desired citations, then click on the "Export Citations" link...


